#### **Course Grading Scheme:**

- 1. Homework Assignments (0%): Problem sets will be assigned weekly on the course website. It is essential that you work all of these problems and understand the course material at a satisfactory level. The problems encountered in the homework assignments will be of comparable difficulty as the problems encountered in the quizzes and examinations. On occasion, a problem from homework assignments may be used in exams with minor numerical changes. Homework assignments will not be corrected, discussed in class, or graded, but solutions to the homework problems will be posted on the course web-site (not Canvas). A 10-minute worksheet will be handed out on most Mondays at the beginning of the class. These worksheets are for practice purposes only. They will be neither corrected nor graded, and as a rule also not discussed during class or office hours.
- **2. Examinations (50%):** Two midterm examinations of 75 min length will be given, each counting 25% to the final grade. **NO MAKE-UP EXAMINATIONS WILL BE GIVEN.** You are only allowed to use the information provided on the examination paper. You must bring your own (non-programmable) calculator. No smart phone, smart watch or similar instruments are allowed during exam.

- **3. Final Exam Preparation Period.** Pre-finals week will be defined as the seven calendar days before the first day of finals. Faculty may cover new course material throughout this week. - 4. Final Exam (50%): The final examination will be given on Thursday Dec. 14, 4:30 pm 6:30 pm. It will be a comprehensive two-hour examination covering all of the course materials. No Make-up final examination will be given. You are only allowed to use the information provided on the examination paper. You must bring your own (non-programmable) calculator. No smart phone, smart watch or similar instruments are allowed during exam.
- 5. Final Grade: The minimum final score for a GUARANTEE 'A' is 90%; 'B' is 77%; 'C' is 60%; 'D' is 50%. The grade will be 'F' if the final score is below 50%. According to the Provost office should students not completing 70% or more of a course be issued a grade/mark of "I." The 70% refer to attendance to class and/or exams, i.e., if you are excused for more than 30% of class and/or exams you will receive an "I".
- **6. Grading Errors and Extra Credits:** All grading mistakes have to be resolved within **one** week after the examinations are returned to the students. Grading mistakes found in the final examination have to be resolved immediately with the instructor. *Solutions to all examinations will be posted on the web within a week after they are graded.* No grade changes will be made at the end of term on the basis of a student wishing to obtain a higher grade than was earned by point total. *No extra credit will be given.*

LOOK* for severe weather refuge location maps located inside most OU buildings near the entrances *2. SEEK* refuge inside a building. Do not leave one building to seek shelter in another building that you deem safer. If outside, get into the nearest building. *3. GO* to the building's severe weather refuge location. If you do not know where that is, go to the lowest level possible and seek refuge in an innermost room. Avoid outside doors and windows. *4.* GET IN, GET DOWN, COVER UP. *5. WAIT* for official notice to resume normal activities.

**Armed Subject/Campus Intruder:** If you receive an OU Alert to shelter-in-place due to an active shooter or armed intruder situation or you hear what you perceive to be gunshots: *1. GET OUT*: If you believe you can get out of the area WITHOUT encountering the armed individual, move quickly towards the nearest building exit, move away from the building, and call 911. *2. HIDE OUT*: If you cannot flee, move to an area that can be locked or barricaded, turn off lights, silence devices, spread out, and formulate a plan of attack if the shooter enters the room. *3. TAKE OUT*: As a last resort fight to defend yourself. For more information, visit http://www.ou.edu/emergencypreparedness.html

Fire Alarm/General Emergency: If you receive an OU Alert that there is danger inside or near the building, or the fire alarm inside the building activates: 1. LEAVE the building. Do not use the elevators. 2. KNOW at least two building exits 3. ASSIST those that may need help 4. PROCEED to the emergency assembly area 5 ONCE safely outside, NOTIFY first responders of anyone that may still be inside building due to mobility issues. 6. WAIT for official notice before attempting to re-enter the building.
